Classic riders must enter & will be charged for 2 other classes on same day.

OPEN DIVISIONS—

Ponies—Adults may ride ponies in any Open or Schooling division other than Children's Pony.

Warm up or schooling rounds prior to a divisional round are unjudged, availability not guaranteed pending entries, and may be ridden by a trainer to be repeated by an amateur.

Open Crossrails Hunter—Horses/Ponies ridden by Professionals or Amateurs. Simple changes allowed.

Schooling Hunter—Horses/Ponies ridden by Professionals or Amateurs. Offered at 2 fence heights, specify at gate—2' and 18". 2' to jump first. Simple changes allowed in Schooling Hunter.

Training and Working Hunter —horse or pony ridden by pro or amateur—open divisions. Fence heights noted on class schedule.

Thoroughbred—For purposes of eligibility, a "Thoroughbred" is defined as any horse that has been registered with The Jockey Club, whether it has raced or not.

AMATEUR DIVISIONS—

Children's Pony—Small/Med/Large to jump 2'3". Larges may choose to jump 2'6" if desired and requested. Ridden by juniors— Separate High Point for Hunter and Equitation. Year End award combined.

Junior/Amateur Rider—2 sep. fence heights offered, 2' to jump first. Fences 2' with no oxers and 2'3 with oxers and walls and gates. Rider not to have jumped over 2'3" in a show, no cross entry into Short/Long Stirrups or Low Children's/Adults. Rider may cross enter the jumper arena 2'3 and lower. High Points split by Hunter and Equitation.

Modified Hunter/Rider—Open to amateur riders of any age who have not competed/jumped higher than 2'3". No cross entry into any division over 2'3". Modified riders may not cross enter into Low Children's/Adult.. Separate high point and year end awards for hunter and equitation. Points based on the horse in hunter, rider in equitation

The **Thoroughbred Equitation** division to be ridden by Amateurs, on registered Thoroughbreds.

Low Children's/LowAdult Hunter/Eq @ 2'6"—horse or pony ridden by adults or juniors of amateur status who have never jumped over 3' at a show, no cross entry to Children's/Adult @ 3'. Separate high point and year end awards for hunter and equitation.

Children's or Adult Hunter @ 29" and 3'— ridden by adults or juniors of amateur status, no cross entry to Low Children's. Division may be combined at shows per entries, Separate high pt for hunter and eq.

NOVICE DIVISIONS—

Walk Division—open to young riders and Para Equestrian riders who are not able to walk and trot by themselves around the show arena. No riders under age 4 allowed and riders must be able to remain upright and ride unassisted with both hands on the reins. HSITP encourages trainers and/or assistants to be present in the arena during the class. Riders are not on a lead, except for Walk Trot Leadline. Judged on Equitation, Pleasure, Hunter Type. Walk Trot Leadline requires the rider to be led at the trot around the arena, demonstrating their ability to post and maintain control of the reins. Periodically throughout the show year the fourth class in the division may be an Obstacle Course Challenge. *Walk classes' points are reported by rider and rider may ride any horse or pony throughout the show year.*

Walk Trot— 3 age groups; the rider's age calculated on the basis of what age they were January 1 of the show year. (Jan—December). Rider never to have cantered in a horse show. Once the rider canters in a group at a show, they are no longer eligible for the Walk Trot Division. Riders may however crossenter into Jumper and Hunter Walk Trot Groundpoles, and Walk Trot Canter 1 @ Time which are considered Walk Trot eligible divisions. Pending entries the age grouped divisions may be combined, however year end award points are split and reported by age. *W/Trot classes' points are reported by rider and rider may ride any horse or pony throughout the show year.*

Walk Trot Crossrails—Split into age groups; Rider not to have jumped higher than crossrails nor cantered in a horse show. Rider may cross enter the Walk Trot Flat divisions, Ground Pole Hunters and Jumpers, Walk Trot Canter 1 @ Time, and Crossrail jumper. *W/Trot classes' points are reported by rider and rider may ride any horse or pony throughout the show year.*

Walk Trot Canter 1 @ Time. For the novice rider who has not cantered in a group at a show Walk Trotters may cross enter. The class rides at the Trot both ways of the arena, judged on equitation and following the second direction the class halts in a line, and one at a time each rider canters around the arena by themselves to the end of the line.

Novice/Vintage Crossrails Rider—Riders of all ages who have never shown higher than a crossrail. This division may also be ridden by experienced amateur riders who are returning to the show ring after a significant absence and need confidence and mileage before moving up. No cross entry of rider with W/T divisions or Short/Long Stirrups. Points based on the rider. May cross enter into Open Crossrails, Pleasure classes or Ground Pole and Crossrail Jumpers. Will WTC as a group. Simple changes allowed. Hunter and equitation *classes' points are reported by rider and rider may ride any horse or pony throughout the show year.*

Short/Long Stirrups Rider—Short Stirrup Riders are 11 & Under, Long Stirrup Riders are 12 & over. Riders to W/T/C on the flat, canter simple verticals and flower boxes with or without gates at 18"-2'. *Simple changes allowed.* Riders of any age not to have jumped fences over 2' at a show., however **no cross entry between Short/Long and Junior/Adult.** High Points split by Hunter and Equitation. Rider may cross enter into Pleasure, Open Crossrails, Schooling Hunter @ 18"-2', and Jumper classes 2' and under. Short/Long hunter and equitation *classes' points are reported by rider and rider may ride any horse or pony throughout the show year.*

****The progression of rider entries in Hunters/Equitation over a period of time usually goes Walk Trot, Short Stirrups, Junior/Adult Rider, Low Children's /Adult 2'6" and lastly, 2'9", 3' Children's /Adult. Once a rider has moved up into another fence height or division such as Short/Long Stirrups into Junior/Adult, it is not appropriate to move backwards ie; show again in Short/Long Stirrups. It is the rider's responsibility to read the class specs and contact the show management if any questions remain prior to making their entries. *It is not the show secretary's role to proof entries for eligibility.* Riders and Trainers are responsible for the validity of their entries. Should an anomaly be brought forward to show management by an exhibitor it will be investigated fully.**



JUMPER SPECIFICATIONS

Courses in 2023 will be judged on the basis of Time & Faults and the third course Table II, 2b (rider stays in the arena and if clear, completes short jump off) unless otherwise specified on the schedule and at the Course Board. Courses are posted 30 minutes prior to arena start.

- There are normally 3 courses posted each day, the Black course— also the course for the warm up round, and the Red Course followed by a third Table II, 2b course which may also be the Classic course. The warm up/schooling rounds are usually the First/Black course.
- **The fence heights Ground Poles to 2' will be judged on the basis of Optimum Time. There will be no Oxers or combinations. Those riders who come the closest to the Optimum Time without going over the Time Allowed will win in order of time and faults. The Optimum time will be determined by "wheeling" and measuring the course distance and determining what the optimum time for completion would be on the basis of the mpm as posted ie; 350 mpm. That's usually an average canter around the course, taking efficient but not difficult turns. The judges definition of Optimum and the judging criteria will be posted on the course board. Throughout the day, the judge has the discretion of levying an 8 second penalty for riders demonstrating excessive and dangerous speed. Accuracy, efficiency, efficient turns, control and a steady but not fast pace wins the class!!
- High Points are calculated on both Saturday and Sunday's placings within a division. The Classics points will count for year end high score Jumper Award.
- Polo shirt, boots/breeches are acceptable ring attire for all jumper classes including Classics. Jackets may be worn however, at the discretion of the exhibitor.
- The Ground Poles, Crossrails and Novice Jumper classes are for those riders new to the jumper arena or seeking confidence to return to the show arena and/or green horses and ponies. It is not appropriate to use these classes as a warm up for higher fence heights over 2'.
- All Open classes may be ridden by professionals or amateurs, however all Children's/Adult Jumper Classes are to be ridden by amateurs only.
- Higher fence heights may be provided upon request.
- At 2' and below, year end award eligibility is based on the rider, who may need to ride multiple horses throughout the year.

CANTERBURY DIVISIONAL YEAR END HIGH POINT AWARDS:

Highest point earners in the divisions listed below will be eligible to receive a Year End Champion and Reserve award and eight ribbons, **Ties are broken by the most show days shown. If a division has to be combined during the show year with another division 3 times due to lack of entries, it will be combined for year end award. There are no minimum show days for eligibility in 2023.**

2023 OVERALL ACEA/CANTERBURY YEAR END AWARDS

All classes in the Canterbury horse shows count

The Final ACEA Canterbury show in September will be double pointed

All Riders who place in their divisions at ACEA/Canterbury are automatically eligible to compete in the Year End HSITP Championships in November at Grand Oaks

HSITP ACEA/Canterbury Perpetual High Point Hunter Award—an engraved bronze inscribed with the horse and owner's name of the hunter with the most points earned in hunter divisions 2' and over *including* all hunter classics and Derbies. Award to be provided for one year to the winner and returned at the end of the following show year. Small keepsake award to winner. Hunter Classics and special designated hunter classics to count. Champion award and Saddle Pad to Reserve w/ 8 Ribbons.

HSITP ACEA/Canterbury High Point Jumper Awards—This engraved award is inscribed with the owner's and horse's name who has earned the most points during the show year in any jumper class 2' or higher. Award to be provided for one year to the winner and returned at the end of the following show year. Small keepsake award to winner. Jumper Classics to count toward the overall award. Champion award to winner and Saddle Pad to Reserve w/8 ribbons.

The Amateur High Point Rider of the Year— **A beautiful Saddle Rack** provided to the amateur rider who has earned the most points in all classes entered with any horse or pony excluding Novice Arena divisions, Crossrail and Novice Jumper. Award to Champion and **Bridle Rack** to Reserve, 8 ribbons awarded in each category

The "HSITP Classic Cup" is a silver or crystal award engraved with the name and owner of the horse or pony who has the highest cumulative points collected during the show year in the Hunter Classics in the Covered Arena at ACEA Canterbury. Award to the winner and 8 ribbons at the Annual Awards Banquet.

The HSITP Canterbury Cup—Engraved Silver Award—provided to the highest points earned in Equitation at 2' and higher during the show year including all Medals 2' and higher. Saddle Pad to Reserve and ribbons to 8th place.

The High Point Novice Rider—The tallest of tall trophies to the Champion and Reserve Champion Novice Riders with the most points earned in the Novice arena. (and huge ribbons/trophies through 8th place) Divisions counted include Walk, Walk Trot, Walk Trot Ground Poles, Walk Trot Canter 1 @ Time, Walk Trot Crossrails, Novice/Vintage Crossrails, Short/Long Stirrups. Eq Medals and Classic, Mini Prix points count as well as Ground Pole Jumper/Hunter and X Rail—18" Jumper divisions count.
