The undersigned, as a Participant/Spectator/Client/Visitor/Guest/Volunteer/Contractor (collectively "Participant"), on his/her own behalf and, if applicable, as the Parent/Legal Guardian of a minor (minor included as "Participant"), for good and valuable consideration, agrees to the following terms and conditions of this Release, Waiver, Hold Harmless, Defend and Indemnification Agreement ("Release"):

- 1. Assumption of Risk and Waiver: Participant understands and accepts that the Inherent Risks of engaging in Equine Activities, while mounted or unmounted, as well as merely being near a horse or pony (collectively "equine"), include, but are in no way limited to, faulty equipment or tack that causes injury or death, Released Parties' failure to make a reasonable effort to determine the ability of Participant to engage safely in an Equine Activity or to safely manage the particular equine provided based on Participant's representations of his or her ability, Released Parties' failure to conspicuously post warning signs of a dangerous inconspicuous condition on the real property, as well as: (a) The propensity of equines to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm, or death to persons on or around them (ex.: jump, run, kick, buck, bolt, spin, rear, strike, bite, stumble, fall, etc.); (b) The unpredictability of an equine's reaction to such things as sounds (ex.: machinery, equipment, doors, rain, wind, thunder, voices, animals, fireworks, guns, motors, music, etc.), sudden movement, and unfamiliar objects (i.e. trailers, barrels, poles, cones, flowers, flags, mini-bikes, water, rocks, construction material, jumps, brush, carts, etc.), persons, or other animals (ex.: leashed or unleashed dogs, wildlife, other equines etc.); (c) Certain hazards such as surface and subsurface conditions (ex.: ground holes, uneven terrain, slippery or deep footing, opened/closed gates, etc.); (d) Collisions with other equines or objects; and, (e) The potential of a participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to Participant or others, such as failing to maintain control over the animal, or not acting within his or her ability (collectively "Inherent Risks"). Participant agrees that engaging in Equine Activities under this Release includes, but is in no way limited to, those listed in the Florida Equine Activity Statute (F.S.A. \$773.01-773.06), riding an equine, and petting, grooming, leading, mounting, feeding, observing, transporting, and otherwise interacting with or merely being in the vicinity of equines (collectively "Equine Activities"). Participant understands illness (including communicable disease), injuries, death, damage, or other loss (collectively "Loss") may result from the Inherent Risks of engaging in Equine Activities or just being near an equine, that equines are powerful and have the potential to be dangerous and cause Loss without warning, that the risks listed in this Release are just a sampling, and Participant is not relying on Released Parties to list all possible equine-related risks. Participant agrees to the following: assume the Inherent Risks in Equine Activities; be responsible for his/her personal health and safety, medical expenses, proper fit and use of safety equipment, and for the risk of Loss of any personal property stored or stabled with Released Parties; purchase and maintain his/her own health and liability insurance; and, waive his/her right to any claims arising from participation in or observation of any Equine Activities, being near an equine, or merely being present on real property owned, leased, rented, borrowed, visited, organized upon, or otherwise occupied or utilized by Released Parties, regardless of whether or not Participant's presence there is related to equines or Equine Activities. The following shall be included as Released Parties herein: Horse Shows in the Park, LLC ("HSITP"); Equine Management Resources, LLC ("EMR"); Jeanne Winslow; the owner, lessor, and/or lessee of the equine and/or real property involved in the Loss; and each of their respective entities, partners, spouse, heirs, beneficiaries, relatives, agents, assigns, employees, volunteers, contractors, working students, instructors, guests, visitors, members, managers, officers, directors, owners, and others acting on their behalf (collectively "Released Parties").
- 2. Release, Hold Harmless, Defend and Indemnify, Release of Likeness: Participant agrees to release, hold harmless, defend and indemnify Released Parties for any Loss incurred by Participant's property, and/or Participant's equine even if such Loss is caused in any part by negligence or other fault of Released Parties (except willful or wanton or intentional misconduct). Participant further agrees to the use or assignment of use of photographs, videos, audios, broadcasts, Internet, new media, or other likenesses of Participant and his/her equine taken for the promotion, coverage or benefit of HSITP, EMR, or any Equine Activity without objection or compensation for use.
- 3. Governing Law, Jurisdiction, Time and Liability Limits, Attorneys' Fees, Jury Waiver: This Release shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida and disputes resolved exclusively by the state court in Brevard County. Participant submits to the jurisdiction and venue of the Court for such purpose. Participant agrees that this Release does not expire, that any and all claims and/or causes of actions for Loss by Participant must be brought within one (1) year of the date accrued, and any surviving claim for personal property Loss is limited to \$250.00. Participant agrees to reimburse Released Parties for all attorneys' fees and costs incurred by Released Parties in enforcing the terms of this Release and/or defending or prosecuting any claims or causes of actions involving or in any way relating to Participant. Participant agrees to waive trial by jury in any action with Released Parties.
- 4. Severability, Modification: If any provision herein is deemed invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent of the law. This Release can only be modified in writing signed by Participant and Jeanne Winslow.
- 5. Participant Certification: Participant certifies that he/she has read this entire Release and understands, agrees, and intends on his/her own behalf, and on behalf of minor Participant, and Participant's spouse, heirs, agents, representatives, relatives, successors, and assigns, to be bound by all of these terms and conditions. Participant signs this Release voluntarily, agrees that this Release does not violate public policy, knows that Participant has other Equine Activity facilities to choose from, and understands that signing this Release is required for Participant to participate in Equine Activities with Released Parties.

MANAGEMENT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO REFUSE ENTRY TO ANY PERSON FOR ANY REASON.

OPEN DIVISIONS—

Ponies—Adults may ride ponies in any Open division other than Children's Pony. Adults may ride a warm up round for the rider in Children's Pony. The Children's Pony division consists of 2 hunter OF and 1 Eq O/F, plus the two flats for daily high point and year end award.

**Warm up rounds are unjudged, availability not guaranteed pending entries, and may be ridden by a trainer to be repeated by an amateur.

Open Schooling Crossrails Hunter—Simple changes are acceptable, Fences may be trotted in and cantered out. Ponies may be ridden by an

adult. Under saddle to W/T/Canter. # of horses to canter at one time may be limited to 2-3 at a time.

Open Schooling 18"-**21**", **Training, Thoroughbred and Working Hunter** —horse or pony ridden by pro or amateur—open divisions. Fence heights noted on class schedule. Simple changes allowed in Schooling Hunter.

Open 2', Working, Training, and Thoroughbred—Ridden by Ams/Pros. For purposes of eligibility, a "Thoroughbred" is defined as any horse that has been registered with The Jockey Club, whether it has raced or not.

AMATEUR DIVISIONS—

Children's Pony—3 fence heights: 2', 2'3", 2'6". No oxers at 2'. Ridden by juniors— *The Children's Pony division consists of 2 hunter OF and 1 Eq O/F, plus the two flats for daily high point and year end award.*

Jr/Amateur Rider—Fences 2', 2'3" w/walls and gates. 2'3" may contain oxers. Rider may start the show year at 2' and move up to 2'3" later in the year. Rider not to have jumped over 2'3" in a show, no cross entry into Short/Long Stirrups. May enter Pleasure, Open Schooling Crossrails, and Schooling Hunter and Jumper classes up to 2'3". High Points split by Hunter and Equitation.

Low Children's/Adult Hunter/Eq—2'6". horse or pony ridden by adults or juniors of amateur status who have never jumped over 3' at a show, no cross entry to Children's/Adult @ 3'. Separate high point and yr end awards for hunter and eq. Pending entries received, may be split Children's and Adults. If division is split Ch/Ad 5 weekends during the show year it will be split for year end award, or if the division is offered as combined Hi/Lo Ch/Ad 5 times during the show year, than year end award will be combined.

High Children's/Adult Hunter @ 2'9", and 3'— ridden by adults or juniors of amateur status, no cross entry to Low Children's. Division may be combined or separated at shows per entries, Separate high pt for hunter and eq.

REMEMBER! Year End Champ/Reserve awards with ribbons through 3rd place go to the top 3 Equitation Medal Riders each year at the Annual Awards Gala!!

NOVICE DIVISIONS—RIBBONS AWARDED THROUGH 10TH EACH SHOW.

Walk Division—open to young riders and Para Equestrian riders who are not able to walk and trot by themselves around the show arena. No riders under age 4 allowed and riders must be able to remain upright and ride unassisted with both hands on the reins. HSITP encourages trainers and/or assistants to be present in the arena during the class. Riders are not on a lead, except for Walk Trot Leadline. Judged on Equitation, Pleasure, Hunter Type. Walk Trot Leadline requires the rider to be led at the trot around the arena, demonstrating their ability to post and maintain control of the reins. Periodically throughout the show year the fourth class in the division may be an Obstacle Course Challenge. Walk classes' points are reported by rider and rider may ride any horse or pony throughout the show year.

Walk Trot—2 age groups; 9 & under and 10 and up, the rider's age calculated on the basis of what age they were January 1 of the show year. (Jan—December). Rider never to have cantered In a horse show. Once the rider canters in a group at a show, they are no longer eligible for the Walk Trot Division. Riders may however cross enter into Walk Trot Canter 1 @ Time which is considered a Walk Trot eligible division as well as Open Schooling Walk Trot and Open Schooling Crossrails, andGround Poles and Crossrails in either the Novice or Jumper arena as long as they are trotting. W/Trot classes' points are reported by rider and rider may ride any horse or pony throughout the show year.

W/T Ground Poles...Riders to demonstrate their skills over the same courses as the W/T Crossrails div however over poles on the ground. Great warm up or segway into learning courses...

Walk Trot Crossrails—May be split into age groups as noted on program, but may be combined per entries rec'd. Rider not to have jumped higher than crossrails nor cantered in a horse show. Rider may cross enter the Walk Trot Flat divisions, Ground Poles, Baby Green Crossrails, Walk Trot Canter 1 @ Time, and Ground Pole & Crossrail jumper if trotting. W/Trot classes' points are reported by rider and rider may ride any horse or pony throughout the show year.

Beginner Walk Trot Canter 1 or 2 @ Time. New Division for year end in 2024!!! For the novice rider who has not cantered in a group at a show Walk Trotters may cross enter.

Novice Crossrails Rider—Riders of all ages who have shown 2 years or less. This division may also be ridden by experienced older amateur riders who are returning to the show ring after a significant absence & need confidence and mileage before moving up. No cross entry of rider with W/T divisions or Short/Long Stirrups. Points based on the rider. May cross enter into Open Schooling Crossrails, Pleasure classes or Crossrail Jumpers. Will WTC as a group. Simple changes allowed. Points are reported by rider and rider may ride any horse or pony throughout the show year. Short/Long Stirrups Rider—Short Stirrup Riders are 9 & Under, Long Stirrup Riders are 10 & over. Riders to W/T/C on the flat, canter simple verticals and flower boxes with or without gates at 18"-21". Simple changes allowed. Riders not to have jumped fences over 2' at a show., however no cross entry between Short/Long and Jr. Amateur. High Points split by Hunter and Equitation. Rider may cross enter into Pleasure, Schooling Hunter @ 18", Open Schooling Crossrails, Jumper classes 18" and under. Short/Long hunter and equitation classes' points are reported by rider and rider may ride any horse or pony throughout the show year.

**The progression of rider entries in Hunters/Equitation over a period of time usually goes Walk Trot, Short Stirrups, Jr./Amateur Rider, Low Children's /Adult and lastly, High Children's /Adult. Once a rider has moved up into another fence height or division such as Short/Long Stirrups into Jr./Amateur, it is not appropriate to move backwards ie; show again in Short/Long Stirrups unless for valid safety reasons upon application in the show office. It is the rider's responsibility to read the class specs and contact the show management if any questions remain prior to making their entries. It is not the show secretary's role to proof entries for eligibility. Riders and Trainers are responsible for the validity of their entries. Should an anomaly be brought forward to show management by an exhibitor it will be investigated fully.

JUMPER SPECIFICATIONS—in 2024 Ribbons awarded through 10th in div Ground Pole—2'!!!

Courses in 2024 will be judged on the basis of Time & Faults unless otherwise specified on the schedule and at the Course Board. Courses are posted 30 minutes prior to arena start. Mpm will be posted and Time Allowed.

- There are normally 3 courses posted each day, the Black course— the Red Course and a 3rd Course which will also be used for the Classic round.
- **The judge has the discretion of levying an 8 second penalty for riders demonstrating excessive and dangerous speed. Accuracy and control
 wins the class!!
- High Points are calculated on both Saturday and Sunday's placings within a division.
- Polo shirt, boots/breeches are acceptable ring attire for all jumper classes including Classics. Jackets may be worn however, at the discretion of the exhibitor.
- The Ground Poles, Crossrails and Novice Jumper classes are for green, inexperienced riders, experienced riders seeking confidence to return to the show arena and/or green horses and ponies. It is not appropriate to use these classes as a warm up for higher fence heights over 2' unless showing 2' and then 2'3"...
- All Open classes may be ridden by professionals or amateurs, however all Children's/Adult Jumper Classes are to be ridden by amateurs
- Higher fence heights may be provided upon request.
- At 2' and below, year end award eligibility is based on the rider, no matter what horse/pony they ride.
- At any point during the show year, An Equitation Division and Medal may be moved to the Jumper arena.

GRAND OAKS DIVISIONAL YEAR END HIGH POINT AWARDS:

Highest point earners in the divisions at Grand Oaks will be eligible to receive a Year End Champion and Reserve award and eight ribbons. The Grand Oaks and Canterbury show circuits are separate in 2024. Ties are broken by the most show days shown or the most points earned over fences.

2024 OVERALL HSITP/GRAND OAKS YEAR END AWARDS

<u>To be eligible for year end award, the rider and/or horse must have competed in a total of 11 show days in the respective division at Grand</u>
<u>Oaks during the 2024 show year.</u> (in 2024 we have a total of potentially 20 show days!) Even if you didn't place in your division at a show, it counts...Each weekend is 2 show days, and certain shows may have your division's classes on a Friday which would be 3 show days.

R. Carrington Aylor Perpetual High Point Hunter Award—a stunning engraved bronze inscribed with the horse and owner's name of the hunter with the most points earned in hunter divisions 2' and over and *including* all Hunter Classics and Derbies. Award is housed in the glass case at Grand Oaks with significant keepsake award to Champ and Reserve w/ 8 Ribbons to our high point hunters. Derbies/special designated hunter classics to count.

High Point Jumper Awards—This engraved marble award is inscribed with the owner's and horse's name who has earned the most points during the show year in any jumper class 2' or higher,. Award is housed in the glass case at Grand Oaks and significant keepsake award to Champion/Reserve with 8 Ribbons to our high point jumpers.

The John F. Payne Perpetual High Point Hunter Pony Award—Beautiful pewter platter engraved and provided for one year to the owner of the pony who has earned the most points during the show year in the Hunter arenas @ 2' or higher. Derbies and Hunter Classics to count. Award and ribbon to Champion and Reserve.

The Amateur High Point Junior (17 & Under) and Adult (18 & Over) Rider of the Year— TWO significant awards provided to the amateur riders in each age category who have earned the most points in all classes entered with any horse or pony *excluding* divisions 21" and under. Award to Champion and Reserve, 8 ribbons awarded in each category

The High Point Trainer of the Year—provided to the Trainer whose riders have earned the most points in all arenas.

The "Weston Cup" is a large silver cup engraved with the name and owner of the horse or pony who has the highest cumulative points collected during the show year in the Hunter Derbies at Grand Oaks. Award housed at Grand Oaks in the glass case and keepsake awarded to winner, and saddle pad to reserve and 8 ribbons at the Annual Awards Banquet.

The "Deborah J. Clifton Memorial Award" is a wonderful bronze on base award to commemorate the memory of one of our most treasured riders we lost in 2023. Those who compete in the Memorial class on Sunday at Grand Oaks are eligible to win this award will be allowed to take the award for a period of one year, returning it at the next Awards Y/E timeframe.

The Kimberden Cup and High Point Equitation Riders—Engraved Silver Award to winner, with Reserve award and 8 ribbons—provided to the highest points earned in Equitation at 2' and higher during the show year. Winning Rider's name inscribed on Perpetual base and trophy housed in the awards case at Grand Oaks.

The Hunt Country High Point Thoroughbred Award presented to the Year End High Point Champion horse who has the most points of any Thoroughbred in the show series, including competition in all arenas, Horse and Owner's name to be placed permanently on the award in the awards case at Grand Oaks. Separate keepsake award to rider.
